

Schedule of declarant's property and income. Owing to want of personal  
and property. Income as follows, the powers of the office of Register and Receiver  
of Bedford County and Clerk of the Orphans Court of Bedford County  
amounting to about two hundred and forty dollars per annum in fees payable by  
the persons who have business in said Office much of which are necessarily  
creditors; the duties of which said Office respectively are necessarily performed  
by a Deputy as the declarant is unable from bodily infirmity to do more than  
subscribe his name to any official paper or legal proceeding or to judge in  
any judicial cause depending before him as Register; that said declarant was appointed  
to said Office on the month of March 1821 and that said Office are held  
at the pleasure of the Executive of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania -  
Sworn to and subscribed on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of  
December 1822 in Open Court.

certify the foregoing to be true to the best of my knowledge and belief, upon the  
accord of my Court. And I do further certify that it is the opinion of  
Court that the total amount in value of all the property and income exhibited  
in the schedule is not worth over One Cent, in as much as the duties of Register  
and Receiver and Clerk of the Orphans Court of Bedford County must necessarily  
be discharged by Deputy where compensation will amount to as much as the fees of  
all those offices and that the income arising from said offices under present  
circumstances and in the course of the present inclement weather is nearly nominal.  
That the declarant Benj't Burd has but two children both sons neither of whom  
is able in any way to support him. That all the real estate of the declarant  
has been sold at Sheriff's or Marshall's sale and made into different parcels  
of the same size; that the declarant is in such indigent circumstances as to be  
unable to support himself without the assistance of his Country.
