shown in the claim, nor are the names of his parents given.

John Boyle enlisted at Carliele, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, no diffinite date given, served as a private in Captains William Count' and Benjamin Fishbourne's companies, Colonel William Butler's Fourth Pennsylvania regiment; he was in the battles of Brandywine, Germantown, in Sullivan's expedition in 1779, in the battle of Newtown and in several skirmishes with the Indians, and was discharged in April, 1782.

He was allowed pension on his application executed, June 22, 1818, then a resident of Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania and aged about sixty-seven years.

In 1830 his wife, Elizabeth, was sixty-six years of age, and one John Boyle, Junior in 1830 was in Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania, his relationship to the family not stated. The Arthur Popular Conference of June 24-1821
