On this 13<sup>th</sup> day of June 1820 personally appeared in open Court being a  
husband of record in the said County Thomas Dodson aged 72 years  
and six months resident in the said County who being first duly sworn  
according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the  
Revolutionary War as follows That he enlisted for the term of one year  
in the fall of the year 1775 (the month and day not recollecting that year  
in the fall of the year) in the state of Pennsylvania in the  
company commanded by Capt. Robert Smith in the Regt. com-  
manded by Col. Anthony Wayne in the line of the state of Penn-  
sylvania in the (not known) continental establishment  
that he served this first term and again enlisted for the term of  
three years in the state of Pennsylvania in the company com-  
manded by Capt. John Smith in the Regiment commanded  
by General Mifflin in the line doth mentioned in the  
continental Establishment that he served this second term and again  
enlisted in the said state for a during the war in the company  
commanded by Capt. John Smith in the Regiment com-  
manded by (the Colonel named not recollecting) in the said  
and in the continental Establishment that he served this last  
term making in and about 6 years in the whole to the best of  
my recollection and was discharged in the year 1781 (some time  
in the fall) in the City of (Pennsylvania) (Philadelphia) State  
of Pennsylvania. My original declaration date May 25<sup>th</sup> one  
thousand eight hundred and eighty and the number of  
the certificate 5805.

And I do solemnly swear that I was  
a resident citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March  
1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in  
any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with  
intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the  
provisions of an act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for  
certain persons engaged in the Land and naval service of the  
United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of  
March 1818 and that I have not now having person or  
for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me  
nor have I any interest other than what is contained in the  
Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

Schedule

One hundred and thirty dollars in trust (a part of my  
partition) and one cow valued @ \$12.

disease and infirmities of body I have been unable to pursue it  
I myself comprise the whole of my family there are none of  
my children residing with me.
