to accommodate the soldiers stationed there, his father moved all of his hemshold effects, with the exception of some beds, into an outhouse. The Indians attacked the place and burned the outhouse with all its contents. In August, 1779, soldier's brothers, Adam and Patrick and his sister, Jane, were killed by the Indians in said Frankstown Township.

John Helliday was allowed pension on his application executed April 1, 1818, while residing in Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania.

In 1830, he stated that his wife was then "upwards" of seventy years of age; that he had a son, aged about forty years and a daughter, aged thirty years. He did not give their names and there are no further data in regard to them.

John Helliday died August 19, 1823, place not shows. Very truly yours
