on the second day of Feby. 1833 Personolly appeared before me
Joseph Adams one of the Judges of the Court of common pleas in
and for said County. Giles Stephens a resident of Antis Township
in the county of Huntingdon and State of Penn. aged
Eighty five years who being first duly sworn according
to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration
in order to obtain the benefit of the act of congress passed
June 7. 1832

That he entered the service of the United States
under the following named officers and served as follows
stated, ^{under} Captain Thomas Clugage Major Robert Clugage and
Lieutenant Lloyd That he entered the Service some time
in the Spring of 1778 and left the Service in the Spring
of 1779 he resides in Bedford now Huntingdon County
that he entered the Service a volunteer and marched
to Fort Robertdeau and served eight months when
he got a discharge from Major Robert Clugage which
is herunto annexed together with a furlough which is also
hence annexed signed by Major Clugage together with the
affidavit of Jacob Ripley who served with me at the same
time - there was one or two companies of Militia but he
cannot recollect the names of the officers -

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension
or annuity except the present and declares that his name
is not on the pension Roll of the agency of any state
