Sir:

I advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, S.40509, it appears that Adam Stonebraker enlisted in York, Pennsylvania or Hagerstown, Maryland in August 1776 and served in Captain William Heyser's Company, Colonels Haussegger's and Weltner's German Regiment, he was in the battles of Trenton, Princeton, Brandywine, Germantown, where he was shot through the leg, battle of Monmouth, and several skirmishes, and served until in August 1779.

He was allowed pension on his application executed May 6, 1818, at which time he was living in Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania, aged sixty-eight years.

In 1820 he stated that his wife was dead and all of his children had left him, but did not give any names.

He died November 1, 1827.

Owing to the very large number of inquiries similar to yours and the lack of a clerical force available for the purpose, only two histories are furnished each inquirer.
