Be it known, that on this fourteenth day of July, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and forty seven, before me George R. McFarlane, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for said County, personally appeared Captain Peter Will, and made oath in due form of law, that he is Administrator of the Estate of John Will, that he is Administrator of the Estate of Barbara Will, who was the widow of Thomas Will, a soldier of the War of the Revolution, and who drew a Pension, at the rate of twenty six Dollars and Sixty two Cents per annum, to the time of his death, which took place on the eighth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and forty two — That the above named Barbara Will, widow of the said Thomas Will, died on the twenty seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and forty six — That the said Thomas Will and Barbara his wife were married in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty one, in York County, Pa. or that neighborhood, that the names of the only children living the said Thomas and Barbara Will are Jacob Will, Peter Will, George Will, Elizabeth, formerly intermarried with George Fetter, died Margaret, formerly intermarried with Charles Mayers, died John Will, Catherine, intermarried with Thomas Flinn, Mary Will, Susanna intermarried with Samuel Lower, David Will, Daniel Will — that he does not know the particulars of the service of the said Thomas Will, but refers to the papers on file in his case — and that he makes this declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the acts of the 9th July 1838, 4th of March 1843 and 17th of June 1844, to the day of the death of the above mentioned Barbara Will.
