

Declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress of the
7th of June, 1832.

On this 24 day of August 1833, personally appeared in open Court before
John D. Davis a Justice of the ~~Peace~~ of Bedford County, now calling Vincent
Stephens, a resident of Dublin Township in the County of Bedford, and
state of Pennsylvania, aged 88 years who being first duly sworn
according to law, doth on his oath, make the following Declaration
in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7, 1832
that he was born near Baltimore State of Maryland came to reside
in Bedford County plank cabin Valley (now Huntington County)
in 1773 and continued there during the Revolutionary War, and now
lives in Dublin Township Bedford County State of Pennsylvania.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following
named officers and served as herein stated.

Entered the service in the spring of the year 1779 Volunteer, Assembled
at Shadysburg our Regiment Commanded by Col. Dawson.
Major Clugage, Capt. Bolton Lieut. Clugage commanded our Com-
pany, with applicant and others (viz) Col. McClain Ethelbert Peckel Joshua
Cornelius Benjamin Cornelius John Wright William Wright John Long
William Long Thomas Long (a few others names not recollect) ^{etc} who had
volunteers to perform such service, was by our Field & Company Officers
appointed (in view of being subject to any Day & Night Campaign) ordered to
guard the frontier in the District of Country, i.e. plank cabin Valley
along Raystown branch of the Juniata River guard the families driven
in by the alarm of Indians to be in readiness ~~to~~ immediately marching
to Mars or run to places when needed to serve as spies & scouting
parties, Danger, hunger, fatigue, had to be endured climbing
over mountains even in the night, at the best only a path was
applicant being well acquainted in the woods was mostly called on
to pilot scouting parties when sent by their officers, on any em-
ergency had to start when called on without any provisions to take
along, pass over an uninhabited & Wilderness Country without food
two or three at a time, (the winter season gave some respite although
not well provided for the endemity of the weather) in the spring
of the year 1780 he continued in the same service, and once even
aid the inhabitants, he erected a Block house at the Head Springs
