was in the said Regiment in the Revolutionary War
and passed to Jersey and was at the taking the
Hudson at the Battle of Trenton, deponent
doth that he served the term of his enlistment
within a few weeks for the American Revolution
ary War for the said Regiment (See his discharge
attached to this Sheet of Paper)

from his reduced circumstances in life he needs the
apostate of his County for Support
