On this fiftieth day of November in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight Hundred and twenty Personally appeared in open Court of the Court of Pleas of Huntingdon County, being a book of Record for the said County Peter Wheeler, aged sixty three years resident in the Township of Chesnutown in the said County of Huntingdon, who being first duly sworn according to Law, doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows - He first went out with the Militia under Colonel Joseph Wheeler, & was at the Battle of Brandywine and that he soon afterwards enlisted as a Private in Captain Richard Hindley's Company sixth Regiment Pennsylvania Line, & was at the Battle of Germantown and that he continued in the Army and in the same Company for three years, and was then honorably discharged. That the date of his original Declaration is the month of March, one Thousand eight Hundred & nineteen, and the Number of his Fidelity Certificate is eleven Thousand five Hundred & eleven.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a Resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my Property, or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the Provisions of an Act of Congress entitled "an Act to provide for certain Persons engaged in the Land of Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818: and that I have not, nor has any Person in Trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or Debts due to me: nor have I any in some other than what is contained in the schedule hereunto annexed and by me subscribed.
